FISHERIES

WHISTLEY MILL

The Whistley mill track has now finally been finished, with over 120 tons of hardcore going into it, hopefully it should last a year or two!

SEARLES FARM LANE

A month or two ago we built a bund at the entrance to Searles farm lane, this was in order to try and stop the fly tipping and general litter that gets deposited there. The bund was built and grass seeded initially and we have now planted a hawthorn hedge along the top.

CLASSROOM AT FARNHAM FLINT

Work on placing a classroom/meeting room/store at Flint adjacent to the hut has started. This will make life a lot easier for the coaches and also separate us from the hut when we eventually get back to having face to face meetings. We hope to get some part funding for this from the 'Get fishing fund'.
